UNDER 40? We can help, through the COMMUNITY CLINICS HEALTH NETWORK

This program provides funding for breast diagnostic services for underinsured or uninsured people under the age of 40 and those who do not qualify for the Every Women Counts program. Community clinics and health centers refer eligible patients they have seen who have an abnormal clinical breast exam or screening mammogram, and need further diagnostic services.

Community Education and Outreach

CHULA VISTA COMMUNITY COLLABORATIVE

Latina Outreach: “Me Cuido Porque me Quiero”

A program to increase awareness of breast cancer, prevention strategies, and available resources through outreach and education to the Latino community. The project will use the Promotora best practice model.

LA MAESTRA COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTER

Breast Cancer Early Detection and Prevention Program

This project is designed to increase breast health education and access to screening services for underserved women in San Diego County, focusing on Latina, immigrant, and refugee women.

SAN YSIDRO HEALTH CENTER

Latina and African American Education Outreach

The goal of this program is to teach Latina and African American women living in San Diego County's South and Central/Southeastern region about the importance of early breast cancer detection. The program uses the Promotora approach and is culturally tailored to meet the specific needs of Latina and African American women.

SCRIPPS MERCY HOSPITAL CHULA VISTA

Healthy Women Healthy Lifestyle Breast Education & Outreach

A Community Health Worker Intervention

This program seeks to enhance and expand the existing culturally sensitive breast health education and outreach for women ages 15 to 40+. Through integration of a health promotion model in the hospital and community, women will receive information to access screening and radiology services.

OPERATION SAMAHAN

Breast Health Education for Filipino Women

This project aims to develop culturally competent/relevant education and resources on breast health, breast cancer screenings, risk factors, and prevention methods for Filipino women.

VISTA COMMUNITY CLINIC

Breast Health Education and Outreach

This program will provide breast health education, outreach and linkage to clinical services for low-income, minority residents ages 40 to 64 with an emphasis on underserved, multi-ethnic women in proven and successful activities to increase knowledge and awareness of how to access low-cost and free breast health care and services among underserved women and their communities.

SOMALI FAMILY SERVICE

Reaching Important Immigrant and Refugee Communities: Bridging the Cultural Divide

The program's goal is to develop, implement and evaluate a culturally sensitive multi-faceted community approach to breast cancer screening and education for Somali and other East African refugee and immigrant women. The program will serve women by providing them culturally and linguistically appropriate education on breast health to overcome individual barriers preventing access to services.

CIRCLE OF FAITH

From Diagnosis to Recovery

The purpose of the program is to provide a safe, culturally sensitive environment to address the specific needs of African American women facing breast cancer. Circle of Faith's key activities include a support group, one-on-one mentoring program, community education outreach, resources, referrals and support.

MANA DE SAN DIEGO

Latina Health festival “Dia de la Mujer”

Support of the MANA de San Diego Latina health “Dia de la Mujer” events serving low-income, rarely/never screened Latinas with breast screenings and mobile mammography services. This partnership is organized annually with San Diego State University and U.C. San Diego.
